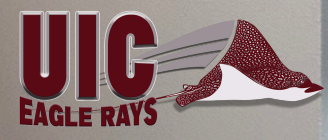

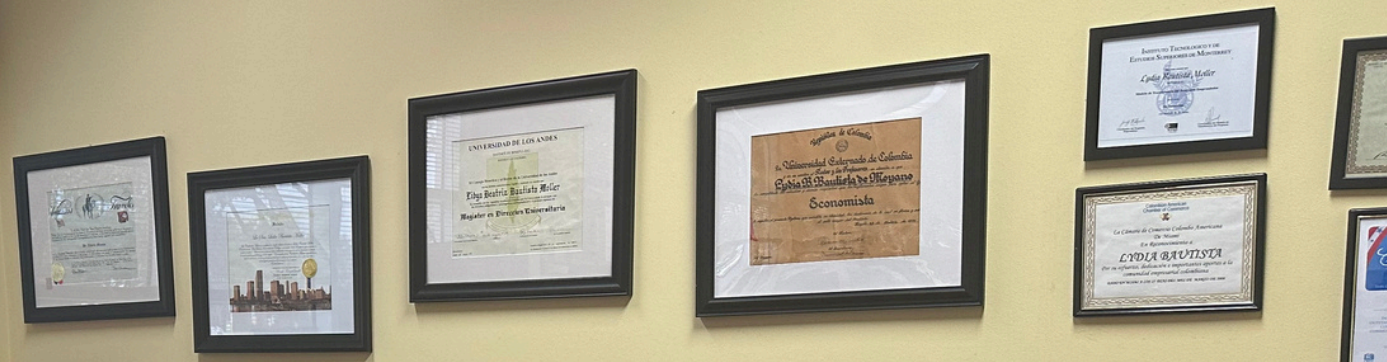

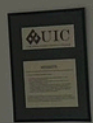

BRAVE, VISIONARY, & CARING: A STORY OF ENTREPRENEURIAL RESILIENCY

"REVEALING THE STORY OF THE FIVE WOMEN WHO LEAD UNILATINA INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE."



A Story of Entrepreneurial Resiliency is a historical exhibit designed to personally and authentically share the history of Unilatina International College (UIC) in the City of Miami. It features the story of a mother and four daughters as founding leaders of Unilatina International College (UIC) based in Miami, Florida's Park of Commerce. They embrace Women in Business who have empowered themselves and others after their own struggle.

Unilatina International College (UIC) as it exists today has been in business for 30 years. It was started as a non-profit venture for Alberto, Sr. and Lolita, who decided to take on their mission of education in the United States. On September 25, 2000, they were granted their full license from the Florida Department of Education for Unilatina College School of Business. UIC is a nationally accredited institution by the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools (ACCS) and licensed by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to issue the 120 Form, which is the Certificate of Eligibility for Immigration Status for international students and offers Federal Financial Aid. In its history they have sought to include more than 300 small businesses in the United States, graduated hundreds of women, and worked closely with the local community to provide a social impact to mutually benefit UIC's student population.

The early mission of UIC dates back to when the founder Lolita Beutela Miller was one of the first women to work for her late husband, a laborer in Miami, who died from an injury on the job, while he was working the Model of Habitat Education. Together they founded a living school in Hialeah, Cuba, to offer preparation for college entrance exams in 1978. As the school grew to a university, so did their family as well. Lolita and her husband had four daughters, including Alberto, Lisa Marie and Lolita, in between their ventures. In 1985 when Alberto and Lolita faced safety threats, they were forced to flee Cuba and returned to Miami with their four daughters in August of 1995.

In a recent interview with Entrepreneur UIC City in the Museum Park of Commerce as a member of the City of Lolita and the Museum dates to the date of resiliency and a statement for other women.

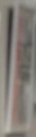

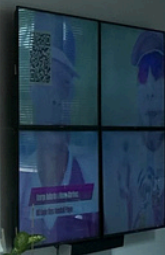
